Description

This course provides participants with the knowledge and skills to operate as part of an emergency control organisation.

Who is this course for?

This course is suitable for those persons in roles such as Communications Officer, Area Warden, Floor Warden or Fire Warden.

Course Duration

2-3 hours (5 hours if combined with our First Attack Firefighting course)

Course Content

- Australian Standards and relevant legislation
- Nature of emergencies
- Functions of the Emergency Control Organisation (ECO)
- Responsibilities of a Fire Warden
- Evacuation procedures & priorities
- Coordinating with ECO members and emergency services
- Post-initial response activities
- Site evacuation exercise

Award Issued

Upon successful completion of the assessment requirements of this course, students will receive a nationally recognised statement of attainment and wallet card.

Recertification

Refreshers recommended every two years.

Pre-requisites

Pre-entry Requirements

Students must be physically capable of participating in the practical activities and demonstrate a basic level of language, literacy and numeracy.

Delivery Methods

The course content will be delivered in a classroom environment using PowerPoint presentations, videos, group discussions and a number of demonstration and skill building activities.

Assessment Methods

Students will be assessed in a relevant, practical scenario simulating an emergency. Underpinning knowledge will be assessed with a theory assessment (containing multiplechoice questions).

Notes

This course is often combined with our First Attack Firefighting course (Total duration - 5 hours).

All of our courses are tailored to site policies and procedures. Appropriate clothing is to be worn when attending training including long pants, long shirts and enclosed footwear. PPE specified by the workplace is also to be worn.
